Alumni Masters

2024 marked the 30th year of the Calgary Flames Alumni Masters Tournament. To date the event has raised over \$3.2 million dollars. The Masters Tournament, presented by ATB, is an annual charity golf tournament hosted by the Alumni. 100% of the proceeds from this years' tournament directly supported Cerebral Palsy Kids and Families and their Adapted Bike Program. The 2024 event raised \$226,000.

The Alumni Masters has also provided a specific time each year for alumni to gather together and engage. This is helpful in creating the strong knit community the Alumni in Calgary have created. Fifty different alumni participated in this year's event.





Cerebral Palsy Kids & Families provide family-focused support, resources, programs and opportunities to Calgary area individuals and families living with physical disabilities. In response to the largest community needs, they have successfully developed flagship programs including their Family Support, Adapted Bike, Equipment Loan and Technology Support programs. Over the past nine years, with the help of the Calgary Flames Alumni Masters Tournament, over 1,500 kids living with a physical disability have experienced the simple joy of riding a bike. Funds raised from this year's event will be used to expand the Adapted Bike and Equipment Program which is the largest

of its kind in North America.

In addition to the day of golf, members of the Alumni attended the Cerebral Palsy Kids & Families Adapted Bike Clinic. Alumni got to meet children who were getting fitted for their custom bike and help families get all set up and see firsthand how the money raised at the Alumni Masters Golf Tournament is used.


Calgary Flames Alumni Toy Drive




About our supported charities:






Glencross Invitational

NHL First Shift & Flames Try Hockey

Jamie Macoun, Curtis Glencross and Dana Murzyn represented the Calgary Flames Alumni participating in the NHL/NHLPA FIRST SHIFT program. This program is designed to ensure a positive experience for new-tohockey families. FIRST SHIFT is designed to facilitate entry into hockey by offering a program that is accessible, affordable and safe and most importantly fun! This program takes away any intimidation as it relates to equipment requirements and rules of the game.

Curtis and Jamie spend over 100 hours helping introduce families to the game of hockey from equipment fittings to on ice instruction and visiting with the families.





In addition to the NHL First Shift Program, the Flames Alumni also supported the Flames Try Hockey program by spending time on the ice with children that are new to the sport. The Calgary Flames foundation in partnership with Hockey Calgary created this program designed for families new to hockey, featuring a six-week series of one-hour on-ice sessions which provide a comprehensive introduction to the sport.

It aims to reduce costs and enhance accessibility for those new to hockey

SuperHEORS is open to youth ages 7-17 with cognitive and physical challenges and like all HEROS programs is completely free. Since becoming involved with HEROS/SuperHEROS, the Flames Alumni have helped create an incredible sense of community throughout the Calgary chapter.

Many SuperHEROS parents never thought their child would have a place in hockey but seeing them skate with the NHL legends they grew up watching changed this narrative and created a world of opportunities they never thought possible.

Brown Bagging for Calgary's Kids


Brown Bagging for Calgary's Kids provides nutritious lunches prepared by volunteers all over the city daily.

Hockey Alberta Foundation Golf Classic



Chinatown Street Festival



On September 10 Cory Sarich travelled to Invermere to participate in the Columbia Valley Rockies Golf Tournament.


Calgary Flames Celebrity Charity Golf Classic

Calgary Flames Ambassadors' Celebrity Poker Tournament




Special Olympics Canada

Copperbelt Charity Golf Classic




Kalix Legacy Foundation

Calgary Flames Celebrity Charity Golf Classic



35th Avnniversary of the 1989 Stanley Cup Championship


